Cluster B Client Assessment

When working with personality disorders, especially Cluster B clients, we know there is a high probability of treatment errors and misdiagnosis due to the complexity of symptom presentation. For example, approximately 40% of individuals with borderline personality were misdiagnosed as compared with only 10% of patients with other disorders (Ruggero, C.J., et al., 2010). If we cannot determine the true diagnosis, we end up with significant treatment difficulties. The worksheet below is designed to assist clinicians in better determining the Cluster B diagnosis.

The statements below are not limited to criteria but symptoms and behaviors that are highly indicative of four distinct, but at times overlapping, disorders.

Directions: Circle the time period(s) when the behavior presented itself. If it was never displayed, circle Never, if it was displayed in the past – meaning not currently, circle Past, and if it is a behavior currently being displayed, circle Present. See below on scoring.
